During these days...we seek our Lord renewal in His gifts of repentance and faith so that we may greet Him with a joyful, clear conscience when He appears as Judge on the Last Day...we seek from Him renewal in His gifts of repentance and faith so that we welcome Him as He comes to us even now in HIs Means of Grace...we seek from Him renewal in His gifts of repentance and faith so that we welcome and faith so that we may welcome our Lord with joy at the great Feast of the Nativity...Advent is a yearly gift when Christians discover anew the truth: 'In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength' (Isaiah 30;15)."
