THE LORD'S SUPPER is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, **any who are not yet instructed**, are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, **are asked first to speak to one of the pastors**.

Please use your freedom in the Gospel to receive either the individual cup or the chalice. If the pastor does not see you holding an individual cup, then he will present the blood of Christ to you in the chalice (common cup). <u>Please NOTE</u>: We have gluten-free wafers available for those who have a gluten allergy. Please speak to a pastor or elder before the service.

The structure of our worship emphasizes God coming to serve us through His Word and Sacrament. Since every aspect of the liturgy is based on the Word of God, we are led by His Word throughout the entire

service. In addition, Lutheran hymnody leads us to praise the Triune God, while teaching the faith that we then confess back to God! Please ask Pastor Al if you would like a free copy of the LSB hymnal (retail: \$30.00) and he will get one to you. Please feel free to use your hymnal in church!

This is the Saving Gospel/The Good News: God forgives you all your sins, gives you eternal life, and abundant life now led by Him *all on account of Jesus Christ by grace through faith in Jesus!* To know Jesus as your Savior is to be delivered from sin, death, and the power of the devil. God is FOR YOU in and through Jesus Christ! Please read Luke 24:47, John 3:16, John 1:29, John 6:51, 1 John 1:7, 1 John 2:2, Matthew 11:28, Romans 11:32, 2 Peter 3:9, Romans 10:12, Romans 3:22, and John 6:40. This service brings the life-giving Word and Sacraments of Jesus to you so that your saving faith in this Gospel would be fed and nourished! Welcome!

Ongoing Services

HOLY ABSOLUTION – The Sacrament of Holy Absolution is offered by appointment with Pastor Espinosa. Pastor is pretty flexible in scheduling these appointments. They are generally conducted in his study but can be done in another location.

HOLY BAPTISM – Infant children of congregation members should be baptized as soon as possible after birth. Baptism may take place in the hospital, at home, or on the first Sunday the child is brought to church. The sooner, the better. Older children and adults ordinarily are baptized after a period of instruction (catechesis); young children and infants are baptized with the promise on the part of parents and sponsors that they will be taught the Christian faith and raised as worshipping members of the body of Christ. If you wish to be baptized or have your children baptized, please speak with Pastor Espinosa.

SICK AND SHUT-IN COMMUNION – Holy Communion will be brought to members who are too frail to leave their homes and come to church. If you are not able to come to church to hear God's Word and eat and drink Jesus' body and blood, please inform your elder or Pastor.

PRAYER FOR THE SICK – If you are ill, facing surgery, or are hospitalized, please be sure to contact your elder or Pastor for anointing and prayer as described in James 5.

WEDDINGS – Please inform Pastor of your intention to marry before you set a firm date. Usually, three months provides ample opportunity to prepare for your marriage as well as your wedding day. Ordinarily, weddings are not performed during Holy Week.

COMMENDATION OF THE DYING—When the last moments are imminent, we offer a beautiful and personal family service filled with prayers and psalms. It is a great way to comfort the dying and to minister to the entire family. This is done in residences, convalescent homes, hospitals, or wherever it needs to be done.

FUNERALS AND MEMORIALS—We stand by our people through this time of bereavement. We meet to comfort loved ones and honor the deceased. We will coordinate with your chosen funeral home and then plan a rich service (or services) to give glory and praise to God who will raise our bodies from the grave. We do not grieve as those with no hope

(1st Thess 4:13), but we still grieve and so we run to the Lord for His compassion and peace given through His Word.

HOUSE BLESSINGS – Scripture says "everything...is consecrated by the Word of God and prayer" (1 Tim 4:4-5) and we have a special service in our pastoral companion book that presents a beautiful service for house blessings. For the past decade St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Irvine has supported The Teen Project led by President/CEO Lauri Burns. Thank you for those of you who purchased Christmas gifts for the young women (some with young children) who are staying at Vera's Sanctuary for Women here in South County. We are now switching gears, asking you to prayerfully consider helping the Los Angeles

location. It is the largest rescue facility for human trafficked young women. Two weeks ago, the new fire chief revoked their fire permit until some very expensive updates are installed. The facility was therefore closed, and the young women staying there were forced to leave. Last week, one of them having to leave (Jasmine Lynne Richardson) died.
