





Special Announcement from Pastor Espinosa

For the past decade St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Irvine has supported The Teen Project led by President/CEO Lauri Burns. Thank you for those of you who purchased Christmas gifts for the young women (some with young children) who are staying at Vera's Sanctuary for Women here in South County. We are now switching gears, asking you to prayerfully consider helping the Los Angeles location. It is the largest rescue facility for human trafficked young women. Two weeks ago, the new fire chief revoked their fire permit until some very expensive updates are installed. The facility was therefore closed, and the young women staying there were forced to leave. Last week, one of them having to leave (Jasmine Lynne Richardson) died. The Teen Project is now seeking to raise \$230,200.00 for the required updates to get their program reopened.
