#### Welcome to Saint Paul's

We praise and glorify the Lord Jesus Christ as He comes to serve and bless us through His Word and Sacraments. We follow the ancient liturgy which draws from the Word of God to order and guide our worship. Its biblical structure has been used in the Christian Church before any denominations within Christianity existed. Our worship emphasizes order, beauty, and reverence. We also celebrate the Holy Eucharist and receive the body and blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins. We are excited about what the Lord is doing at Saint Paul's, and it is our great joy to serve you!

This is the Saving Gospel/The Good News:

God sent His Son Jesus Christ to take your sin upon Himself and Jesus gave to you His perfect righteousness and holiness. In Christ, it is a fact, and it is reality that your sins are forgiven, covered by His blood. And because Christ defeated death, you too – as you trust in Him alone – have eternal life. This is the Good News. It is so powerful because the Holy Spirit works through it to create and sustain faith in our hearts to hold to our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ. If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation! That's the Christian, a forgiven sinner who lives for God and loves their neighbor. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

## The Lord's Supper

The Holy Sacrament is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. #### **Choose Life**

Deuteronomy 30:15-20: The Choice of Life and Death

11"For this commandment that I command you today is not too hard for you, neither is it far off. <sup>12</sup>It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will ascend to heaven for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and do it?' <sup>13</sup>Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will go over the sea for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and do it?' <sup>14</sup>But the word is very near you. It is in your mouth and in your heart, so that you can do it.

<sup>15</sup> "See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil. <sup>16</sup> If you obey the commandments of the LORD your God that I command you today, by loving the LORD your God, by walking in his ways, and by keeping his commandments and his statutes and his rules, then you shall live and multiply, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to take possession of it. <sup>17</sup> But if your heart turns away, and you will not hear, but are drawn away to worship other gods and serve them, <sup>18</sup> I declare to you today, that you shall surely perish. In the Name of Jesus. Amen! When God creates faith in us, He wants us to know life, feel life, and experience life. He wants us to live. Not just for 70 or 80 years, but with a life that is connected to Him. And how long does God live? He lives forever. Thus, He wants you to live forever too. That's what happens of course when His life becomes yours. And it has. You are baptized into Christ. Forever life is already yours, so yes, death can take a hike. It has.

All this happens through the gift of faith. But that gift of faith doesn't just pop into existence out of thin air. It is facilitated by the Word of Christ which was/is contained in the water of your holy baptism. This Word of Christ is what facilitates your receiving faith. In fact, by the Spirit working through it, your faith has been created by God. What does Romans 10:17 say? "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." Even babies when baptized hear the Word upon them, God's Name in the water, with the water, under the water, and they are born again so as to have faith. Not a teaching that gets along with human reason, but entirely biblical: "Yet you are he who took me from the womb; you made me trust you at my mother's breast." (Ps 22:9) Can babies have faith? God's Word says so when they are baptized. Never confuse true faith, trust in the heart with mere intellectual formulation.

The Word of Christ is the means, bridge, conduit, connector between God's power and your soul. Through it, He gives you faith. This is not just taught in the New Testament. It is taught throughout Scripture, and Moses who was giving God's Word to Israel proves it here at Deuteronomy chapter 30: The "commandment [which is the Word of Christ]...[God says] is not too hard for you, neither is it far off. It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will ascend to heaven for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and do it?' Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will go over the sea for us and bring it to us, that we may hear it and do it?' But the word is very near you. It is in your mouth and in your heart, so that you can do it." (Deut. 11-14) This is an astounding word!

Last Sunday, I made the statement, "Not only does God save you, but He wants you." And Deuteronomy 30 demonstrates this truth. God does not wait for you to get around to calling Him. Rather, He reaches out to you. You don't have to ascend to heaven to bring His Word to you, nor do you have to go beyond the sea so that the Word might finally be yours. Rather, the Lord says to you Christians, "the word is very near you. It is in your mouth and in your heart, so that you can do it." (vs. 14)

This is the non-negotiable qualifying introduction to what comes next, because what comes next is God commanding us to choose life, choose God, loving Him and obeying Him. These words if taken in isolation provoke red flags: is this a shift to works-righteousness? Is this a confusion of Law and Gospel? The short answer: "No." With the qualifier: "But the word is very near you. It is in your mouth and in your heart, so that you can do it," the words that follow have nothing to do with denying the grace of God. The Word which is in you Christians -- in your mouth and in your heart -- leads and enables you to do it (that is, He – the Word – does it so that united to you, you do it too). This brings out the radical nature of God's love and generosity. Grace quite simply knows no limits in Christ Jesus:

- 1. He creates us.
- 2. He showers us with what we need for our body and life.
- 3. He gives us His Word to create faith in us.
- 4. He then enables us to do what He commands.
- 5. He then rewards us in glory for doing what He enabled in us to do.

At what juncture does His overflowing and generous love and mercy end? It never does.

The problem is that we still possess our old man, the sinful nature, the flesh. There is still that part of us that fights against God. Moses led God's people up to the Promised Land. They were being prepared by God to enter it through these very words in Deuteronomy 30. This leads us to appreciate some parallels between the Israelites and ourselves in the Church:

- 1. God delivered them from slavery in Egypt. He has delivered you from slavery to sin.
- 2. God baptized Israel as He led them out of bondage in the Red Sea. He has baptized you and has led you out of bondage in the font.
- 3. God gave Israel Moses to teach them and point them to the coming Messiah. God has given you His Church to teach you and point you to the Messiah/Christ who has come.
- 4. God gave Joshua to take them into the Promised Land. God has given you the New Joshua/Jesus to lead you into the Promised Land which is the eternal Kingdom of God.
- 5. God sustained Israel through the atoning blood of the sacrifices. God sustains you through the blood of His Son in and through the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

And in both cases, as we travel with our Savior leading us, we also experience "the land of Cana" while we are still in this world. There are many ways of referring to this land. In the Old Testament, the sin and evil in the land of Cana was reminiscent of the overflowing idolatry and unrighteousness in such kingdoms as Babylon. This imagery of corruption in the world was carried into the New Testament as Rome was treated as the new Babylon. Be it "land of Cana" or "Babylon," these are alive and well in their 21st century versions including the United States here in So Cal, here in our backyards, and in and around us all. We are in Babylon and Cana still.

The realization has caused some Christians throughout history to overreact. If the world is this contaminated with sin, then perhaps the best course is to flee and build a Christian society, perhaps in the desert or some other far away place. God's Word will not permit this. He calls you and me "salt" and "light" (Matthew 5), He calls us to be witnesses and fishers of men. God directs us through St. Paul not to associate with sexually immoral people, but then he writes at 1 Corinthians 5:10: "not at all meaning the sexually immoral of this world, or the greedy and swindlers, or idolaters, since then you would need to go out of the world." But rather, he is talking about avoiding those in the Church – who pretend to be Christians – but are rather dedicated to the desires of their own flesh. There is a big difference and the bottom line in our current consideration is that God wants us here, in Cana, in Babylon, and he wants us to love the people in this world with the love of Christ.

And this is where the rest of Deuteronomy 30 comes in. God knows then Christians that if you are going to effectively dwell in the world, then you must be equipped to love it, but not love it; you will have to be in it, but not of it; you will have to embrace it but not condone its evil. You and I are supposed to be like Saint Paul in 1st Corinthians 9 and become like those

"outside the Law," be along side those who live as if there is no Law; those who may indeed live as if the only principle is licentiousness. Who will bring Christ to them if not us? Who will shine where there is darkness if not us? Who will bring love where there is hatred? Who will bring forgiveness where there is hard-heartedness? Who will bring medicine for the soul when the soul is sick, if not us, the Christians in this world?

But if we are going to love the world, then we must not love the world. And if we are properly not loving the world, we learn to properly love the world. So how does one enter the mine field without being blown to bits? Deuteronomy 30, that's how:

<sup>15</sup> "See, I have set before you today life and good, death and evil. <sup>16</sup> If you obey the commandments of the LORD your God that I command you today, by loving the LORD your God, by walking in his ways, and by keeping his commandments and his statutes and his rules, then you shall live and multiply, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to take possession of it. <sup>17</sup> But if your heart turns away, and you will not hear, but are drawn away to worship other gods and serve them, <sup>18</sup> I declare to you today, that you shall surely perish. You shall not live long in the land that you are going over the Jordan to enter and possess. <sup>19</sup> I call heaven and earth to witness against you today, that I have set before you life and death, blessing and curse. Therefore choose life, that you and your offspring may live, <sup>20</sup> loving the LORD your God, obeying his voice and holding fast to him, for he is your life and length of days,"

There is only one way to live in Cana and Babylon: we must enter it and love it with Christ's love, to be as Christ, to be Christ in these places. To know – theologically – his active righteousness: Christ's active righteousness in and through His people who follow Him. And what will Christ lead us to do as we love this world so that we can love its people? He will lead us to choose life and in so doing we will also honor 1st John 2:15 not to love the world. That is, we will love the people in this world for all to know Christ and we will use (as good stewards) the things in this world to facilitate these relationships like St. Paul used the altar dedicated to the unknown god at the Areopagus in Athens.

And for this to happen we will see Christ with us, and to see Him with us is to witness His obedience to the Father. When is it occurring and valid? Always. Where Christ is, the choosing of life and what is good is always happening. It *must*. Where Christ is, His Word – the way of life -- is chosen with new minds, new hearts, and new wills, not to be saved, but because we already are.

Choosing life is much more than a slogan. It is not merely another way of speaking of being "pro-life" for example. Of course, we are pro-life for the

unborn, the newly born, the poor and impoverished, those who are mistreated, the sick, those with disabilities, and the elderly. James chapter 1 is the only place in the New Testament that discusses the word "religion." What is true religion? According to God, it is the person who bridles their tongue, who visits orphans and widows in their affliction, and keeps oneself unstained from the world." (vss 26-27) There it is again, these are in the world and very active in the world, thus in this sense embracing the world, and yet they are not loving the world in such a way as to be stained by it. But what is really going on? We are choosing life. Choosing to serve the elderly, the sick, the prisoner. This is authentic discipleship.

And this is where the Gospel comes in, because without the Gospel the pursuit of authentic discipleship will only be a return to the Law, and the prison and failure of the flesh. Christ, however, immerses Himself in all of it. He is the One reaching out and He is the One being reached.

In Matthew 25: It is Christ who is in His people to feed, who gives drink, who welcomes in, who clothes, who visits the sick, who visits the imprisoned. And it is Christ who receives the food, receives the drink, is welcomed, is clothed, is the sick, and is imprisoned. And if Christ is the One doing it, then yes, you and I will do it because we are in His life, His love, His mercy, and His choosing.

Jesus said His disciples, "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you." (John 15:16) That is how we choose life by abiding in Christ, who is the Life, who chooses us. He chooses you, so that you are enabled to choose; He loves you so that you are enabled to love; He forgives you so that you are enabled to serve; He sacrifices His life for you, so that you may sacrifice for others. You and I deserved none of that which He did for us and still does for us, and so He teaches us that "deserve" has nothing to do with it.

So, we go out into the world to love those in the world, and it has nothing to do with deserve. It is not about who deserves this or who deserves that. In fact, we deserve judgment. We ourselves deserve condemnation for it was our sin that fell on Christ on the cross, but instead He chose not to let it fall on us as well, but only on Him. The price has been paid, so that when you were baptized, God chose you. He said, "You are mine. Forgiven! Washed! Clean! Accepted!" And yes, called, and not just called – because many are called – but also chosen. Few are chosen. *You* are chosen.

The day came when the Father asked the Son, "Here is your cup. What will you choose?" The Son knew what the cup meant. And for that reason,

asked the Father to take it from Him. But the Son also knew that it was His to choose, so He chose good. He chose you.

And now this is not, "God has done His part, so you do yours now," not at all, it is rather the echo of the King's eternal and all powerful choosing that has found you as its echo chamber. His choosing is in you, His chosen one and where Christ is, Christ continues to choose. And He chooses life and so living in Him, we follow Him, and we keep His Word and His grace will keep you choosing Him who has chosen you. Choose life Christians. Christ the Life has chosen you.






